When the nurse develops and utilizes this ability, clients tend to feel much better about themselves and more understood. Some people confuse empathizing with sympathizing. To establish a good nurse-patient relationship, the nurse should use empathy not sympathy. Sympathy is defined as the feelings of concern or compassion one shows for another. By sympathizing, the nurse projects his or her own concerns to the client, thus, inhibiting the client's expression of feelings. To better understand the difference between the two, let's take a look at the given example. "I know how depressing that situation is.
