History of nigerian constitutional development. Introduction: The importance of a constitution in any given society cannot be overemphasized. The constitution, in Nigeria's situation, is the supreme law of the land which all acts of individuals and of parliament must not contravene. In order to calm things down, the then colonial secretary, Oliver Lyttleton called the leaders for a conference in London. Some issues were discussed during the conference and committees were set up. Their reports were to be considered in the Lagos conference of 1954. It was the conference that led to the Lyttleton constitution. The constitutional conferences of 1953 and 1954 held in London and Lagos respectively gave birth to the Lyttleton constitution. 'Constitutional development' [in the dependent territories], writes Sir Ivor Jennings, 'is always empirical' because these places 'have different origins and different traditions.' He further points out that as a result of the reliance placed on 'the man on the spot, usually the Governor', who consults local opinion, 'there is a constant process of experimentation' in which 'the experience of one territory is used in another'. Political Culture: Participation in Colonial Government. American colonial governments were a local enterprise rooted deeply in communities. For instance, elected bodies, specifically the assemblies and county governments, directly determined the development of a wide range of public and private business. For instance, there were often "country" and "court" factions representing those opposed to and in favor of, respectively, the governor's actions and agenda. British-appointed governors also faced various degrees of opposition and resistance over new colonial policies which resulted in much negotiation between assemblies, voting populations, and colonial authorities. Massachusetts also had a strong populist faction that typically represented the province's lower classes. The crisis also demonstrates a wider process under which national authorities are increasingly finding their powers constrained by the actions of both supranational and subnational actors.
