Indeed, jazz-inspired American popular music has not always been well served by its own defenders, who have tended to romanticize rather than explain and describe. In broad outlines, the history of American popular music involves the adulteration of a "pure" form of folk music, largely inspired by the work and spiritual and protest music of African Americans. Most of the watershed years turn out to be permeable; as the man who is by now recognized by many as the greatest of all American musicians, Louis Armstrong, once said, "There ain't but two kinds of music in this world. Good music and bad music, and good music you tap your toe to." Armstrong's own career is a good model of the nature and evolution of American popular music at its best. Ewen approaches this exhaustive history of American music chronologically, covering the multitude of popular musical styles, their influences, their creators and performers, and the times that shaped them, including the influence of radio, film, and electronics. He begins in 1620 and concludes the final chapters in a section entitled "Since 1960" which covers rock, folk, soul, country, Broadway, and the decline of Hollywood. For jazz standards readers and researchers, Ewen's book provides a great historical overview of American popular music. There are especially interesting chapters on the jazz standards repertoire. His second book, *Hebrew Music*, came out the same year, and 1933 saw the publication of *Wine, Women and Waltz; A Romantic Biography of Johann Strauss, Son and Father* and *From Bach to Stravinsky: The History of Music by Its Foremost Critics*. *Composers of Today* followed in 1934 and a second edition appeared in 1936. 1936 also witnessed Ewen's marriage to Hannah Weinstein, a New York teacher. Although still publishing books, Ewen expanded his horizons in 1937 to become music editor of *Cue*, a New York music magazine. Now, thirty or forty titles later, Ewen's career reaches its pinnacle with *All the Years of American Popular Music*. This massive 850-page volume is a stunning work of research and writing.
