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## Artist's Talks

"Anonymity's struggle in art and science", Curious Discussions, Visual Art Projects, Glasgow

Christine Borland is an artist who draws on the skills and expertise of other disciplines in her work, particularly from the field of science. Several early works referred to forensic science and the techniques used in solving crimes, made familiar through many a TV drama series. Other major works developed through direct collaborations and discussions with specialists in human genetics and other related areas of study. A project entitled From Life, first Christine Borland (born 1965, Darvel, Ayrshire, Scotland) is a British artist and one of the Young British Artists (YBAs). Borland attended the University of Ulster, and the Glasgow School of Art. She works with forensic science and medicine, including police and judicial processes and collaborations with the Medical Research Council's Social and Public Health Sciences Unit at Glasgow University.
