But moderate abolitionists chided womenâ€™s rights activists for their â€œselfishâ€ demands and considered womenâ€™s rights a distraction from the fight against slavery.

Americans looked on these changes with a mixture of enthusiasm and suspicion, wondering how the moral fabric of the new nation would hold up to emerging social challenges. Increasingly, many turned to two powerful tools to help understand and manage the various transformations: spiritual revivalism and social reform. Reacting to the rationalism of the eighteenth-century Enlightenment, the religious revivals of the Second Great Awakening reignited Protestant spirituality during the early nineteenth century. Methodism achieved the most remarkable success, enjoying the most significant denominational increase in American history.
