Every year, rescuers help refloat many disoriented mammals that get stuck in the coastal waters or sand during low tide. However, last weekâ€™s simultaneous stranding of two pods, totaling over 650 pilot whales, in the shallow muddy waters of Golden Bay at the northwest tip of South Island is almost unprecedented. Local marine experts say it is the largest known whale stranding since 1985 when 450 of the mammals were found beached in Auckland, and the third largest on record.
